


Virginia Tech

- The Center for Neutrino Physics was founded in 2010 within the Virginia Tech Department of Physics.
- 17 faculty members (resident & affiliated).
- Experimental program includes: Borexino, Cuore, Daya Bay, Double Chooz, KamLAND, MicroBooNE, proto-DUNE, DUNE, e-Ar/Ti scattering at JLab.
- Strong theory effort, who closely interacts with the experimental efforts.
